She is the convener of the annual Global Inclusive Educators Virtual Summer Camp, in partnership with Nessy, which brought together 150 participants from 6 continents in the year 2020 edition. She has trained and empowered numerous parents, teachers and caregivers locally and internationally and is a published author of three crucial books, namely: Special Needs Made Easy (Vol.1), Mastering Autism and Dyslexia Bible.
